Fred lived on the Common with his partner Isabella (called Mrs. Garrard) and their three children, Wilfred, Florence and Dorothy. The day before he enlisted Fred did the right thing by Isabella and the children by getting married at Wayland Register Office. His occupation until enlistment was General Labourer, although he had served eighteen months with 4<sup>th</sup> Norfolk Regiment. He received GSW (Gun Shot Wounds) to face, head and arm on 20<sup>th</sup> July 1916, recovered, and was listed as missing on 25<sup>th</sup> November 1916. On 2<sup>nd</sup> August 1917 he was officially recognised as having died on or since 21<sup>st</sup> October 1916. His body (skull & two hips) was found with his Disc. At
